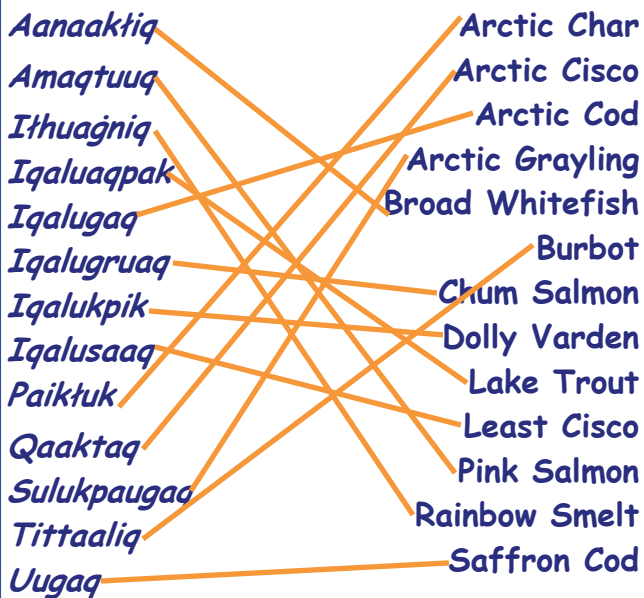


Iñupiat FISH Matching

FUN FACTS

Did you know that....

....the scientific name for **walrus** (*Odobenus rosmarus*) probably means “tooth-walking whale-horse.”

....**walrus** seem to use their tusks for hauling out on ice and, in males, for sparring with other males.

....**walrus** spend 2/3 of their life in the water.

....**walrus** have about 400-700 whiskers (or vibrissae) on their snouts, and they use these whiskers to find food.

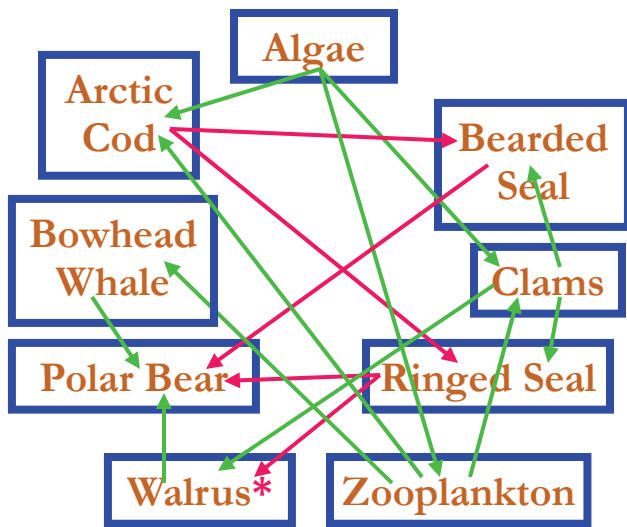
....**walrus** can eat up to 6000 clams in a single feeding event.

....**walrus** blubber can be up to six inches thick.

....**walrus** tusks have been used for making fish hooks and other tools, jewelry, masks and other artwork.
